Junior Courses:



FROM THE LIBRARIAN, STEVE SYKES

Issue 175 of Bow International is dedicated to the one and only Kim Hyung Tak or Coach Kim, as he is known amongst those who have come under his directions. In anticipation of the 20th anniversary of his school of archery in June, the editor of BI sat down and discussed his 50+ years career in archery and this is presented in a four page report of the interview. Following on from this, there are testimonials from athletes who talk about their experiences at the Kim Hyung Archery School in South Korea.



Highlights from the 2024 Archery Trade Show (ATA) in ST Louis, U.S. are presented over another 4 pages of this issue. This features descriptions and images of a selection of new equipment from the 156 new products launched at the show.



A 3-page article on Gold Tip Arrows explores the history and product range of the durable brand.

After outlining the history of the company, the author looks at the range of arrows available from outdoor and indoor target products through to those designed for 3-D shooting and onto ones designed for traditional shooters, although these are not wooden but of carbon construction with superficial wood grain appearance! The feather fletches, however, make them a bit traditional.

Need a new clicker? If so, a quick read will introduce you to the E1Carbon Clicker developed by Australia's bronze medallist Alec Potts at Eliza Archery.



There are three models called "Straight", 'Sexy Leg" Bend and the "Sexy Leg" Ultra Soft. If these capture your attention, go read the article or visit www.elizaarch



For those interested in a wider global perspective, there are five pages of text and images exploring **Archery in Nuristan**, an area in Afghanistan. The images of technique and locally manufactured arm guards and finger protection aids are well worth a look.





If you thought Hyundai was all about motor cars, think again.

The Hyundai Motor Group is a significant supporter of Korean Archery and its athletes, and three examples show how technology from the company is being used to support Korean Archery Olympians amongst others.



These range from Custom Equipment and 3D printing of bow grips, to precision machines to test bow performance, and through to non-contact joint tracking tech to help prevent injury.

A feature article titled "The Unmarked Game" aims to help develop skills and make improvements when shooting unknown distances. The article explores what archers can do for themselves as well as the role their equipment plays when shooting unmarked rounds.

In addition to the usual archery news from around the world, this issue has more advice for archer exercises with emphasis on shoulder routines this time. There are also the usual "Ask the Experts" questions and answers including a couple specifically for barebow focussing on plunger and arrow rest issues.

LOUD SHIRT DAY

The funds raised will be donated to an event called 'Movember'. This is an annual event involving the growing of moustaches during the month of November to raise awareness of men's health issues, such as prostate cancer, testicular cancer, and men's suicide.

May (end) initial site preparation


June (mid) construction starts
